

Bibliography Format

BOOK:

Author's Last Name, First Name. *Title of book*. Place of publication: Name of publisher, year of publication.

Moore, Roger. *How I Fly Helicopters; a Treatise on Bravery and Courage*. Boston: Houghton-Mifflin Co., 1982.

NEWSPAPER ARTICLE:

Author's last name, First name. "Title of the Article." *Name of the Newspaper*. Date of the newspaper, (editions).

Rubenstein, Steve. "The New BART Riders." *San Francisco Chronicle*. August 31, 1992, home edition.

"Mercy HS Team Champs at Regional Debates." *The Independent*. January 10, 1985.

MAGAZINE ARTICLE:

Author's last name, First name. "Title of the Article." *Name of the Magazine* volume number (month, year): pages.

Fuller, Robert. "The Last of the Cartwright Boys." *Magazine of the West* 54 (Oct. 1964): 5. (NOTE: "5" is the number of pages in the article, not the page number it starts on.)

ESSAY IN A BOOK:

Author's last name, First name. "Title of the Article." In *Title of the Book*. Edited by Author's first name Last name, pages. Place of publication: Name of publisher: year of publication.

Doates, Mairsy. "Ruminations of Pasture-Dwelling Animals of the Irish Coast." In *How Green is My Valley*, edited by Jonathan Granny-Smith, 15. London: Cambridge University Press, 1991.

ONLINE DATABASE:

Author's last name, First name. "Title of the material accessed." Date of the material (if given.) *Title of the Database*. Publication medium [Online]. Name of the computer service. Date of access.

Jones, Smithee. "Population densities of America." October, 1980. *US Census Data*. Online. Nexus/Lexus. February 10, 1999.

CD-ROM

Author's last name, first name. "Title of the material accessed." Date of the material (if given.) *Title of the database*. Publication medium [CD-ROM]. Name of the vendor (if relevant). Electronic publication date.

WEB

Author's lastname, firstname. "Title of the material accessed." Date of the material (if given). *Title of the Website*. Date of access. <website address>.

NOTE: If an article does not indicate the author's name, then move "Title" to the left – it becomes the first item in the citation. File it alphabetically among the last names.

NOTE: All web addresses must be to the page where you FOUND the information – not the home page, not the search page, not some other page!
